

Mission Online Night School Summary

- The students can take only ONE course at a time.
- Before registering, be sure to verify that you have all the prerequisites and that you are suited to the faster pace of the program.
- The students cannot enroll in a course if they are taking the course in a day school or another school.
- The students are in the accelerated cohort Deadlines Provided.
- The school age students are expected to attend in person on Wednesdays and log into their course virtually on Mondays.
- The students are expected to engage in learning activities, complete coursework, access support materials, write tests, communicate with the teacher, and track their own academic progress.
- During online sessions, the students will be involved in activities via ZOOM live lessons, or phone calls to troubleshoot any concerns.
- Students are not expected to be in front of the computer screen for 3 hours Monday/Wednesday evenings, however, they are expected to log in to class, meet deadlines, stay in regular communication with their teacher and get help.
- A student who is not attending or logging in regularly will be considered absent and may be withdrawn from the course.
- Students will be required to complete all assignments, tests/ exams on time and maintain regular in-person and virtual attendance. Failure to do so may result in removal from the program and a failing mark on the student's permanent educational record.
